summary of EOI

Cultural Capital has been appointed by Health Infrastructure NSW (HI) to curate the art program for the new Acute Services Building (ASB) at Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital (SDMH).

Cultural Capital is seeking expressions of interest for two opportunities within the Acute Services Building (ASB):

- 1. The Shoalhaven Street entrance to the hospital
- 2. Paediatric treatment areas

Artists may register their interest for one or both opportunities.

This EOI is open to artists living or working in, or with a connection to, the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District. See page 15 for a map of the Illawarra Shoalhaven area.

All applicants should read the PDF excerpt of the Shoalhaven Hospital Arts in Health Strategy to ensure that their proposals are relevant to this document. It is an endorsed plan that covers the entire commissioning program for SDMH.

project overview

Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital (SDMH will welcome the addition of an Acute Services Building (ASB) to its campus. The ASB is scheduled for completion in 2026 and will elevate the current campus to the standards of quality and care expected from hospitals today.

The ASB is an entirely new building, constructed on a greenfield site within the existing campus. SDMH is located in Nowra and services an area within the Illawara Shoalhaven Local Health District (ISLHD) known as 'Shoalhaven'. This area comprises the Shoalhaven City Council Local Government Area, home to 108,500 people.

The ASB will house medical, surgical and geriatric inpatient units, mental health, cardiac outpatient, intensive care units as well as ambulatory care, medical imaging and rehabilitation treatment spaces. Working spaces for administrative and clinical staff, front of house and retail services are also included. Blocks B and D are also undergoing a refurbishment and are included in this strategy.

The art program responds to the needs and opportunities within the hospital community. The hospital sits on Jerrinja and Wandi Wandian Country and welcomes Aboriginal staff and consumers from across the Dharawal and Yuin nations. A significant Blackbutt tree sits right on campus and across the road, the Shoalhaven river curves its way toward the Pacific ocean.



curatorial vision

a canopy of care

Caring exchanges between all people, under the protective canopy of the hospital lies at the heart of this vision.

Within the grounds of Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital sits an ancient blackbutt tree. The tree has a powerful presence, it reaches 38 metres skyward and its canopy spans 10 metres in diameter. It has been acknowledged by local Aboriginal community members as 'an important place to come back to, as a reminder of being on Country' (Yerrabingin, Design Jam 2022).

Today this monumental canopy stands strong as a marker of positive exchange between those within the hospital community. The curatorial vision brings this metaphor of 'caring exchange' into focus for the arts program.

By design, the hospital is like the canopy of the Blackbutt tree. Both are complex machinations where energy sources are captured to support life, where nourishment, resources and care are constantly exchanged between organisms. Neither the tree nor the hospital discriminate, they are places where everyone can visit to receive what they need. Here, exchanges can be seen as a method of care, one organism needing to interact with another.

This vision folds an arts program into the hospital that centres on these human principles.



shoalhaven street entry artwork

Artwork description

A large scale artwork commissioned for the entry stairwell on levels zero and one. The total length of the wall is approximately 23.5 metres.

Objective

This commission will welcome visitors from Shoalhaven Street, an alternative entry to the hospital.

This commission may take the form of a painting, light weight wall sculpture or applied design.

Conceptually, it will responsive to the vision of 'a canopy of care' as it relates to a place of positive exchange and to the natural, local environment.

The artistic process to create this work may involve community collaboration with locals, including staff at the hospital.

Audience

Being a non-clinical space, this artwork is an opportunity to bring comfort and a sense of natural vitality to all visitors as they arrive at the hospital and journey through the new building.


Patients, staff, carers and locals will be able to access this artwork. It is accessible to the general public.



















paediatric treatment rooms

Artwork Description

Artworks for five Paediatric treatment rooms in the ASB, level 1 and refurbished areas of the existing hospital in Block B, level 2. These artworks will be installed as printed vinyl on walls or ceilings.


Objective


Artists are invited to develop five artworks that are joyful, colourful and uplifting. The artworks will be a point of distraction to patients during their treatments. The artist may also consider coloured patterns, playful imagery or local natural systems, such as rivers and ocean ecosystems to offer immediate connection and interest.

Audience

This suite of vinyl artworks aims to appeal specifically to a core audience of people aged 4 - 13 years but the spaces will welcome people of all ages.

These artworks are in clinical floors and not accessible to the public.









considerations common to both opportunities

- 1. The key objective for these commissions is to create a calm and soothing environment for patients and staff, offering interest and distraction in hospital spaces.
- 2. Clinical floor commissions hold the potential to be transformative and exert a substantial, immediate influence on the wellbeing of patients and staff.
- 3. Consideration should be given to the accessibility needs of the people using these locations. People may have different cognitive abilities, have physically limiting bed-based conditions or mobility requirements
- 4. While the works should help distract the patient from a distressful experience, they should also compliment the clinical requirements of the space and support clinician to patient communication and treatment
- 5. Infection control requires that all surfaces can be wiped down and regularly cleaned
- 6. Both of the EOI opportunities should consider the curatorial theme of 'A Canopy of Care'

Process

EOIs will be reviewed by a selection panel comprising representatives of Health Infrastructure, Shoalhaven Hospital Redevelopment teams and external advisors.

A number of artists/creative teams will be shortlisted from this process – shortlisted artists enter a subsequent round of competitive procurement. Each shortlisted artist will be paid a fee between \$2000-\$3000 to develop a concept.

Selection Criteria

Artists/creative teams will be selected to progress to the next stage based on the below criteria:

- 1. Work and live within, or have a connection to, the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District footprint. For more information see page 15.
- 2. Creative practice: work in a style complementary to health care environments.
- 3. Demonstrated experience of artist/creative team as relevant to this project.
- 4. Availability to meet project timelines.



consultation

It is extremely important that the artworks in hospitals are embraced and accepted by the diverse communities receiving treatment, visiting or working in the hospital, to ensure that the artworks are sensitive to the values of local community.

Consultation - Paediatric Artworks

The artist who is selected to create artworks for the paediatric wards will consult with paediatric clinicians to develop their concept. This engagement will take the form of 1-2 sessions, either online or in-person, where clinicians will share key values, needs and constraints for the artist to consider when developing their concept. Consultation may continue during design development. The project team, Cultural Capital, Health Infrastructure and ISLHD will support the artist to coordinate and structure their consultation.

Consultation - Shoalhaven Street Artwork

Shortlisted artists will meet with representatives from the Multicultural Health Unit (MHU) and the Aboriginal Health Unit (AHU) in the preparation of their concept. This consultation will be 2 x video/in person meetings and facilitated by Cultural Capital. In this meeting, the Unit Representative will speak generally about values and experiences of their community in the hospital. The artist will have the opportunity to ask questions. Minutes from these meetings will be provided to artists.

The successful artist for this commission way wish to incorporate community engagement or co-design into the creation process of this work, this will be outlined further for shortlisted artists in the artist brief.



terms & conditions


- 1. By submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI), artists and creative teams accept the Terms & Conditions associated with the commissions.
- 2. The EOI form must be completed in full to be eligible, including submitting via email the Creative Response as outlined on page 11
- 3. Artists/creative teams must be Australian citizens or have permanent resident status.
- 4. Artists/creative teams who are not 18 or older, must provide details of their parent or guardian with their submission.
- 5. Artists/creative teams must hold or be willing to arrange product and public liability and professional indemnity insurance coverage.
- 6. The selected artist/creative team gives non-exclusive rights to Health Infrastructure and Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District to publish the selected concepts on social, print and other media as appropriate. Selected concepts will be attributed to the artist/creative teams.
- 7. All examples of previous works submitted for the EOI must be original works created by the artist/creative team who is submitting the EOI.
- 8. The decision of the selection panel regarding the selected artist/creative team will be final. In the event of any other dispute, the decision of the General Manager, Shoalhaven Hospital shall be final.
- 9. Artists/creative teams will not be paid for EOI submissions.
- 10. Artists/creative teams own the copyright of their work.
- 11. Use of the concept by the artist/creative team shall attribute Health Infrastructure and Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District, subject to separate agreement.
- 12. Health Infrastructure reserves the right not to proceed with the commissions without prior consultation.

Illawarra Shoalhaven local health district



Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District (ISLHD) covers an area of 5,687 square kilometres, along the coast in NSW from Helensburgh in the north to North Durras in the south.

Dharawal and Yuin peoples are the traditional custodians of the land, which encompass five language groups: Wadi Wadi, Dharawal, Wandandian, Walbanga and Yuin.

In 2021 the estimated population was 404,000 residents, and over the decade to 2031, the overall population is projected to increase to 470,000.

Throughout the exterior and interior, the ASB reflects the local landscape, with the forms of the Shoalhaven River inspiring design details.



stakeholder engagement

To inform the curatorial approach to the art program, Cultural Capital completed comprehensive stakeholder engagement with key user groups in June and July of 2023.

Groups consulted included:

- · Clinicians who will treat patients in the wards/clinics at the new hospital building
- · Elders and other representatives from the Aboriginal community
- · Staff representatives from the multicultural community and the Aboriginal community
- · Staff at Shoalhaven Hospital, beyond clinical practitioners
- · Patients who have received treatment at Shoalhaven Hospital

Key findings:

- · Present local artists and community collaborations
- · Celebrate local natural environments and vistas
- · Enhance cultural safety
- · Provide spaces for staff, patients and their families to connect
- · Alleviate stresses of the hospital environment
- · Provide tactile, interactive or sensory experiences
- · Create moments that evoke daily life outside the hospital
- · Provide art forms that are appropriate, safe and professional





shoalhaven st mural, level 0 & 1, elevation




shoalhaven st mural, level 0, floor plan



shoalhaven st mural, level 1, floor plan




shoalhaven st mural, level 0, casual seating area



- Visitors may spend longer time at this section of the mural while they enjoy a coffee or food






paediatrics treatment rooms, level 1, ASB floor plan






paediatric treatment room #1 - medical imaging wait area




paediatric treatment room #2 - wait & play area


level 1, ASB building



paediatric treatment room #3 - procedure room








paediatric treatment room #4 - ambulatory care play area
